Students in the Forestry and Natural Resources pathway will develop foundational knowledge about the fields of forestry and natural resources, including potential career paths. Instruction is focused on providing career awareness and exploration, as well as relevant skill development in these fields. Onsite classes focused on real-world experiences exploring our local landscapes and their management. This pathway can help launch students towards obtaining industry-specific certifications available at local community colleges. Plumas Charter School CTE Pathways are a 20-credit course sequence including; introduction, concentration, and capstone courses.
